Re: Data Breach Notification

Dear Attorney General Delaney:

Our law firm represents the American Pharmacists Association (“APhA”), a 501(c)(6) entity which is a national professional society of pharmacists, representing pharmacists, scientists, students, technicians, and others interested in advancing the profession. Pursuant to applicable New Hampshire law, APhA hereby notifies you of a recent data security incident involving approximately 81 New Hampshire residents.

On May 28, 2012, APhA discovered that its website was defaced by an unknown individual or group. A subsequent, independent forensic investigation determined that unauthorized individuals had access to certain APhA computer servers between April 23, 2012 and May 28, 2012. As of the date of this letter, the forensic investigators have determined that those servers included files with credit card numbers – some active and some expired - of approximately 81 New Hampshire residents; however, the investigators have been able to confirm actual access to, and acquisition of, the credit card numbers of only 2 of those New Hampshire residents. Please note that it is possible that the foregoing numbers do not represent 81 unique New Hampshire residents; rather, one or more New Hampshire residents may be included more than once in the total number of residents.

Within minutes of learning of the incident, APhA shut down its web site and related computer servers. APhA then reported the incident to law enforcement, engaged an experienced forensic cybersecurity team to conduct an aggressive investigation, and implemented a plan to prevent further data access. APhA continues to work with law enforcement in connection with the incident.


