Re: Notice of Data Event

To Whom It May Concern:

We represent Cast-Crete USA, Inc. ("Cast-Crete") located at 6324 County Road 579, Seffner, FL 33584 and are writing to notify your office of an incident that may affect the security of certain personal information relating to one (1) New Hampshire resident. This notice will be supplemented with any new significant facts learned subsequent to its submission. By providing this notice, Cast-Crete does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Nature of the Data Event

On or about April 5, 2023, Cast-Crete detected suspicious activity within an email account. Upon learning of this activity, Cast-Crete took prompt steps to confirm the security of the email account and launched an investigation to determine the nature and scope of the incident. On or about April 18, 2023, the investigation determined that one email account was accessible to an unauthorized individual on April 5, 2023. While the investigation was able to determine the email account was accessed, it was unable to determine whether any specific emails or attachments within the account were actually accessed or acquired by an unknown actor.

The information that could have been subject to unauthorized access includes

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Notice to New Hampshire Resident

On or about December 22, 2023, Cast-Crete provided written notice of this incident to one (1) New Hampshire resident. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as *Exhibit* A.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, Cast-Crete moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of Cast-Crete systems, and identify potentially affected individuals. Cast-Crete is also working to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. Cast-Crete is providing access to credit monitoring services for through Experian, to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, Cast-Crete is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud, including advising individuals to report any suspected incidents of identity theft or fraud to their credit card company and/or bank. Cast-Crete is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.

Cast-Crete is providing written notice of this incident to relevant state regulators, as necessary, and to the three major credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion.

Cast-Crete USA, Inc. ("Cast-Crete") writes to inform you of a recent cyber incident that may impact the privacy of some of your information. While we do not have any indication that any identity theft or fraud related to your information has occurred as a result of this incident, this notice provides you with additional information about the incident, our response, and steps you may take to further protect your information against identity theft and fraud, should you determine it is appropriate to do so.

What Happened? On or about April 5, 2023, Cast-Crete detected suspicious activity within an email account. Upon learning of this activity, we took prompt steps to confirm the security of the email account and launched an investigation to determine the nature and scope of the incident. On or about April 18, 2023, the investigation determined that one email account was accessible to an unauthorized individual on April 5, 2023. While the investigation was able to determine the email account was accessed, it was unable to determine whether any specific emails or attachments within the account were actually accessed or acquired by an unknown actor.

What Information Was Involved? Cast-Crete began a thorough investigation of the emails and files within the accessed account in order to identify individuals whose personal information may have been impacted. Once the review was complete, we worked to find addresses for potentially impacted individuals. On October 20, 2023, we determined that your name, [Extra1] were potentially impacted by this incident.

What We Are Doing. We take this incident and the security of information within our care very seriously. Upon discovery of this incident, we immediately launched an in-depth investigation to determine the full nature and scope of this incident and moved quickly to assess the security of our email accounts and notify potentially affected individuals. We will also be notifying state regulators, as required.

As an added precaution, we would like to offer you twelve months of complimentary access to credit monitoring services through Experian. If you wish to receive these services, you must enroll by following the below enrollment instructions as we are unable to activate these services on your behalf.

What You Can Do. We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud and to review your accounts statements and credit reports to detect errors or suspicious activity. You can find more information about obtaining a free copy of your credit report, protecting against potential identity theft and fraud, and other resources available to you in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Personal Information*. Monitor Your Accounts

Under U.S. law, a consumer is entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. To order your free credit report, visit <u>www.annualcreditreport.com</u> or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. You may also directly contact the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below to request a free copy of your credit report.

Consumers have the right to place an initial or extended "fraud alert" on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a one-year alert that is placed on a consumer's credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer's credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer's identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any one of the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, consumers have the right to place a "credit freeze" on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without the consumer's express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in your credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a security freeze, you may need to provide some or all of the following information:

- 1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
- 2. Social Security number;
- 3. Date of birth;
- 4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
- 5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
- 6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, etc.); and
- 7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if you are a victim of identity theft.
