Re: Incident Notification

Dear Attorney General Formella:

We are writing on behalf of our client, Churchill Mortgage Corporation ("Churchill"), to notify you of a security incident involving New Hampshire residents.

Churchill recently concluded its investigation into a security incident involving unauthorized access to an employee's email account. Upon identifying the unauthorized activity, Churchill promptly secured the account and launched an investigation. The investigation determined that an unauthorized party gained access to one employee's email account between November 13, 2021 and November 18, 2021. Churchill conducted a thorough review of the employee's email mailbox, and, on February 10, 2022, Churchill determined that the files contained personal information of twenty (20) New Hampshire residents, including their name and one or more of the following: financial account number and/or Social Security number.

On April 12, 2022, Churchill is providing written notice via United States Postal Service First Class Mail to the New Hampshire residents whose personal information was potentially accessed by an unauthorized party, in accordance with N.H. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 359-C:20. A copy of the notification letter is enclosed. Churchill is offering the New Hampshire residents whose Social Security number was affected a complimentary, one-year membership to credit monitoring and identity theft prevention services through to Experian. Churchill is encouraging all affected individuals to remain vigilant by reviewing their accounts for unauthorized activity. Churchill has also established a dedicated, toll-free phone number where all individuals may obtain more information regarding the incident.

To help prevent a similar incident from occurring in the future, Churchill has implemented additional security measures to enhance the security of its network and continues to train its employees concerning data security.

We are writing to inform you of an incident that may have involved some of your personal information. This notice explains the incident, measures we have taken, and additional steps you may consider in response.

We recently concluded our investigation of an incident involving unauthorized access to an employee's email account. Upon first discovering the unauthorized activity, we immediately secured the account and launched an investigation. In connection with this investigation, we learned that an unauthorized party gained access to one employee's email account between November 13, 2021 and November 18, 2021. We conducted a thorough review of the employee's email mailbox and, on February 10, 2022, we identified an email or attachment containing your name and name, Social Security number, and financial account number ending

To date, we are unaware of any misuse of the information maintained in the employee's email mailbox. However, we want to let you know this happened and assure you that we take this very seriously. We encourage you to remain vigilant by reviewing your account statements and credit reports for any unauthorized activity. As a precaution, we are offering you a complimentary one-year membership to Experian's IdentityWorks identity monitoring services. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal information and provides you with identity protection services focused on immediate identification and resolution of identity theft. If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should immediately contact the Federal Trade Commission and/or the Attorney General's office in your state. You can obtain information from these sources about steps an individual can take to avoid identity theft as well as information about fraud alerts and security freezes. You should also contact your local law enforcement authorities and file a police report. Fraud Alerts and Credit or Security Freezes:

Fraud Alerts: There are two types of general fraud alerts you can place on your credit report to put your creditors on notice that you may be a victim of fraud—an initial alert and an extended alert. You may ask that an initial fraud alert be placed on your credit report if you suspect you have been, or are about to be, a victim of identity theft. An initial fraud alert stays on your credit report for one year. You may have an extended alert placed on your credit report if you have already been a victim of identity theft with the appropriate documentary proof. An extended fraud alert stays on your credit report for seven years.

To place a fraud alert on your credit reports, contact one of the nationwide credit bureaus. A fraud alert is free. The credit bureau you contact must tell the other two, and all three will place an alert on their versions of your report.

For those in the military who want to protect their credit while deployed, an Active Duty Military Fraud Alert lasts for one year and can be renewed for the length of your deployment. The credit bureaus will also take you off their marketing lists for pre-screened credit card offers for two years, unless you ask them not to.

Credit or Security Freezes: You have the right to put a credit freeze, also known as a security freeze, on your credit file, free of charge, which makes it more difficult for identity thieves to open new accounts in your name. That's because most creditors need to see your credit report before they approve a new account. If they can't see your report, they may not extend the credit.

How do I place a freeze on my credit reports? There is no fee to place or lift a security freeze. Unlike a fraud alert, you must separately place a security freeze on your credit file at each credit reporting company. You'll need to supply your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and other personal information.

After receiving your freeze request, each credit bureau will provide you with a unique PIN (personal identification number) or password. Keep the PIN or password in a safe place. You will need it if you choose to lift the freeze.

How do I lift a freeze? A freeze remains in place until you ask the credit bureau to temporarily lift it or remove it altogether. If the request is made online or by phone, a credit bureau must lift a freeze within one hour. If the request is made by mail, then the bureau must lift the freeze no later than three business days after getting your request.

If you opt for a temporary lift because you are applying for credit or a job, and you can find out which credit bureau the business will contact for your file, you can save some time by lifting the freeze only at that particular credit bureau. Otherwise, you need to make the request with all three credit bureaus.
