Re: Incident Notification

Dear Sir or Madam:

We are writing on behalf of our client, Teamsters Local 945 Benefit Funds ("Teamsters"), to notify your office concerning a cybersecurity incident.

Teamsters recently completed an investigation into an incident involving unauthorized access to an email account on the Teamsters network. Teamsters immediately began an investigation, and measures were taken to address the incident. Through its investigation, Teamsters determined that an unauthorized person obtained access to a single email account between June 14, 2021 and June 29, 2021. Teamsters conducted a thorough review of the data involved, and on August 3, 2022, determined that an email or attachment included the name, Social Security number and/or financial account number of four New Hampshire residents.

On September 2, 2022, Teamsters is providing notification to the four New Hampshire residents in accordance with N.H. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 359-C:20 via United States First-Class mail.¹ A sample copy of the notification letter is enclosed. Teamsters will offer each of the New Hampshire residents a complimentary one-year subscription to identity monitoring services through Experian. Teamsters also will establish a dedicated, toll-free call center that individuals can call to obtain more information regarding the incident.

¹ This report does not waive Teamsters' objection that New Hampshire lacks regulatory authority over it related to any claims that may arise from this incident.

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To help protect against an incident like this from happening in the future, Teamsters continue to review our systems and are taking steps to enhance our existing security measures.

We are writing to inform you that we identified and addressed an incident that involved some of your personal information. This notice explains the incident, measures we have taken, and some steps you may consider taking in response.

Teamsters identified a security incident that involved an email account on our network. We immediately began an investigation, and measures were taken to address the incident and secure our email platform. Through our investigation, we determined that an unauthorized person obtained access to a single email account<

We wanted to notify you of the incident and assure you that we take it very seriously. As an added precaution, we are offering a one-year membership of Experian's[®] IdentityWorksSM Credit 3B. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal credit information and provides you with identity protection services focused on identification and resolution of identity theft. IdentityWorksSM Credit 3B is completely free to you and enrolling in this program will not hurt your credit score. We remind you it is always advisable to be vigilant for incidents of fraud or identity theft by reviewing your account statements and free credit reports for any unauthorized activity. You may obtain a copy of your credit report, free of charge, once every 12 months from each of the three nationwide credit reporting companies. If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should immediately contact the Federal Trade Commission and/or the Attorney General's office in your state. You can obtain information from these sources about steps an individual can take to avoid identity theft as well as information about fraud alerts and security freezes. You should also contact your local law enforcement authorities and file a police report. Fraud Alerts and Credit or Security Freezes:

Fraud Alerts: There are two types of general fraud alerts you can place on your credit report to put your creditors on notice that you may be a victim of fraud—an initial alert and an extended alert. You may ask that an initial fraud alert be placed on your credit report if you suspect you have been, or are about to be, a victim of identity theft. An initial fraud alert stays on your credit report for one year. You may have an extended alert placed on your credit report if you have already been a victim of identity theft with the appropriate documentary proof. An extended fraud alert stays on your credit report for seven years.

To place a fraud alert on your credit reports, contact one of the nationwide credit bureaus. A fraud alert is free. The credit bureau you contact must tell the other two, and all three will place an alert on their versions of your report.

For those in the military who want to protect their credit while deployed, an Active Duty Military Fraud Alert lasts for one year and can be renewed for the length of your deployment. The credit bureaus will also take you off their marketing lists for pre-screened credit card offers for two years, unless you ask them not to.

Credit or Security Freezes: You have the right to put a credit freeze, also known as a security freeze, on your credit file, free of charge, which makes it more difficult for identity thieves to open new accounts in your name. That's because most creditors need to see your credit report before they approve a new account. If they can't see your report, they may not extend the credit.

How do I place a freeze on my credit reports? There is no fee to place or lift a security freeze. Unlike a fraud alert, you must separately place a security freeze on your credit file at each credit reporting company. You'll need to supply your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and other personal information.

After receiving your freeze request, each credit bureau will provide you with a unique PIN (personal identification number) or password. Keep the PIN or password in a safe place. You will need it if you choose to lift the freeze.

How do I lift a freeze? A freeze remains in place until you ask the credit bureau to temporarily lift it or remove it altogether. If the request is made online or by phone, a credit bureau must lift a freeze within one hour. If the request is made by mail, then the bureau must lift the freeze no later than three business days after getting your request.

If you opt for a temporary lift because you are applying for credit or a job, and you can find out which credit bureau the business will contact for your file, you can save some time by lifting the freeze only at that particular credit bureau. Otherwise, you need to make the request with all three credit bureaus.
