



## COMMANDER POSITION AVAILABLE NEW HAMPSHIRE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S DRUG TASK FORCE

The Attorney General invites interested candidates to apply for the position of New Hampshire Attorney General's Drug Task Force Commander.

The Attorney General's Drug Task Force (DTF) launched in 1986 as a statewide initiative to combat the illegal manufacture, sale, and distribution of controlled substances. It is comprised of law enforcement officers from the Attorney General's Office as well as local, county, and state agencies. With supervision and administrative support from the Attorney General's Office, the DTF leads, coordinates, and conducts undercover drug enforcement operations across the state while operating from four regional offices.

The Commander is directly responsible for DTF administration and operations, recruiting and recommending qualified DTF officers, training and evaluating DTF members, coordinating efforts with participating agencies and federal partners, and supporting civil forfeiture and criminal proceedings against offenders.

The Commander must be certified or eligible for certification as a police officer under New Hampshire law. The successful candidate will be well qualified on the basis of education and experience—including: five (5) years of undercover drug investigation experience, preferably as a supervisor; familiarity with New Hampshire drug laws and criminal procedures; analytical, operational, and computer skills; previous experience working in an interagency environment; and demonstrated leadership aptitude. Final selection is contingent upon satisfactory background investigation and reference checks.

The salary range is \$57,633.16 to \$80,186.08 (Unclassified Salary Grade BB); a superior benefit package (including health, dental, and life insurance) is available.
