Re: Burns, Figa & Will, P.C. – Incident Notification

Dear Attorney General MacDonald:

McDonald Hopkins PLC represents Burns, Figa & Will, P.C. (“Burns, Figa & Will”). I am writing to provide notification of an incident at Burns, Figa & Will that may affect the security of personal information of four (4) New Hampshire residents. Burns, Figa & Will’s investigation is ongoing, and this notification will be supplemented with any new or significant facts or findings subsequent to this submission, if any. By providing this notice, Burns, Figa & Will does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law or personal jurisdiction.

Burns, Figa & Will learned that an unauthorized individual may have obtained access to one Burns, Figa & Will employee email account. Upon learning of the incident, Burns, Figa & Will immediately secured the account and commenced a prompt and thorough investigation. After an extensive forensic investigation and manual document review, Burns, Figa & Will discovered on May 26, 2021 that the compromised email account that was accessed between August 14, 2020 and October 15, 2020 contained a limited amount of personal information, including the affected residents’ full names and one (1) or more of the following: Social Security number and medical information.

Burns, Figa & Will has no indication that any of the information has been or will be misused. Nevertheless, out of an abundance of caution, Burns, Figa & Will wanted to inform you (and the affected residents) of the incident and to explain the steps that it is taking to help safeguard the affected residents against identity fraud. Burns, Figa & Will is providing the affected residents with written notification of this incident commencing on or about June 25, 2021 in substantially the same form as the letter attached hereto. If a Social Security number was impacted, Burns, Figa & Will is offering the affected residents complimentary one-year membership with a credit monitoring service. Burns, Figa & Will will advise the affected residents to always remain vigilant in reviewing financial account statements for fraudulent or

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irregular activity on a regular basis. Burns, Figa & Will will advise the affected residents about the process for placing a fraud alert and/or security freeze on their credit files and obtaining free credit reports. The affected residents will be provided with the contact information for the consumer reporting agencies and the Federal Trade Commission.

At Burns, Figa & Will, protecting the privacy of personal information is a top priority. Burns, Figa & Will is committed to maintaining the privacy of personal information in its possession and has taken many precautions to safeguard it. Burns, Figa & Will continually evaluates and modifies its practices to enhance the security and privacy of the personal information it maintains.

The privacy and security of the personal information we maintain is of the utmost importance to Burns, Figa & Will, P.C. (“Burns, Figa & Will”). We are writing with important information regarding a recent security incident that may have impacted some of your information. Burns, Figa & Will provides legal services to business clients and may have access to your information as a result of your participation in a stock sale, company merger, or other similar transaction. We want to provide you with information about the incident, tell you about the services that we are offering to you, and let you know that we continue to take significant measures to protect your information.

What Happened?

We learned that an unauthorized individual may have obtained access to one Burns, Figa & Will employee email account.

What We Are Doing.

Upon learning of the issue, we commenced an immediate and thorough investigation. As part of our investigation, we engaged external cybersecurity professionals experienced in handling these types of incidents. We devoted considerable time and effort to determine what information was contained in the affected email account. After an extensive forensic investigation and manual document review, we discovered on May 26, 2021 that the compromised email account that was accessed August 14, 2020 to October 15, 2020 contained certain elements of your personal data. While we have no indication or evidence that any of that data has been or will be misused, we thought it important to notify you of this incident.

What Information Was Involved?

The impacted files contained some of your personal information, specifically your [REDACTED]

What You Can Do.

We are not aware of any reports of identity fraud or improper use of your information as a direct result of this incident. Nevertheless, we are offering a complimentary one-year membership of Experian IdentityWorksSM Credit 3B. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal information and provides you with identity protection services focused on immediate identification and resolution of identity theft. IdentityWorks Credit 3B is completely free to you and enrolling in this program will not hurt your credit score. For more information on identity theft prevention and IdentityWorks Credit 3B, including instructions on how to activate your complimentary one-year membership, please see the additional information provided in this letter.

The following materials also provide other precautionary measures you can take to protect your personal information, including placing a fraud alert and/or security freeze on your credit files, and/or obtaining a free credit report. Additionally, you should always remain vigilant in reviewing your financial account statements and credit reports for fraudulent or irregular activity.

2. **Placing a Fraud Alert on Your Credit File.**

Whether or not you choose to use the complimentary 12 month credit monitoring services, we recommend that you place an initial one-year "fraud alert" on your credit files, at no charge. A fraud alert tells creditors to contact you personally before they open any new accounts. To place a fraud alert, call any one of the three major credit bureaus at the numbers listed below. As soon as one credit bureau confirms your fraud alert, they will notify the others.

3. **Placing a Security Freeze on Your Credit File.**

If you are very concerned about becoming a victim of fraud or identity theft, you may request a "security freeze" be placed on your credit file, at no charge. A security freeze prohibits, with certain specific exceptions, the consumer reporting agencies from releasing your credit report or any information from it without your express authorization. You may place a security freeze on your credit report by contacting all three nationwide credit reporting companies at the numbers below and following the stated directions or by sending a request in writing, by mail, to all three credit reporting companies:

In order to place the security freeze, you'll need to supply your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and other personal information. After receiving your freeze request, each credit reporting company will send you a confirmation letter containing a unique PIN (personal identification number) or password. Keep the PIN or password in a safe place. You will need it if you choose to lift the freeze.

If you do place a security freeze *prior* to enrolling in the credit monitoring service as described above, you will need to remove the freeze in order to sign up for the credit monitoring service. After you sign up for the credit monitoring service, you may refreeze your credit file.

4. **Obtaining a Free Credit Report.**

Under federal law, you are entitled to one free credit report every 12 months from each of the above three major nationwide credit reporting companies. Call **1-877-322-8228** or request your free credit reports online at www.annualcreditreport.com. Once you receive your credit reports, review them for discrepancies. Identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. Verify all information is correct. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting company.

5. **Additional Helpful Resources.**

Even if you do not find any suspicious activity on your initial credit reports, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) recommends that you check your credit reports periodically. Checking your credit report periodically can help you spot problems and address them quickly.

If you find suspicious activity on your credit reports or have reason to believe your information is being misused, call your local law enforcement agency and file a police report. Be sure to obtain a copy of the police report, as many creditors will want the information it contains to absolve you of the fraudulent debts. You may also file a complaint with the FTC by contacting them on the web at www.ftc.gov/idtheft, by phone at 1-877-IDTHEFT (1-877-438-4338), or by mail at Federal Trade Commission, Consumer Response Center, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20580. Your complaint will be added to the FTC's Identity Theft Data Clearinghouse, where it will be accessible to law enforcement for their investigations. In addition, you may obtain information from the FTC about fraud alerts and security freezes.

If your personal information has been used to file a false tax return, to open an account or to attempt to open an account in your name or to commit fraud or other crimes against you, you may file a police report in the city in which you currently reside.
