On behalf of InvenSense, Inc., I am writing to inform you about a recent incident that involved information relating to 3 New Hampshire residents who are current and former InvenSense employees.


InvenSense was the target of an e-mail "phishing" scam. Specifically, on April 12, 2016, an unknown third party sent an email message impersonating our Chief Executive Officer to an InvenSense team member, requesting copies of employee 2015 W-2 tax forms. The InvenSense team member responded to the request and provided the copies of the 2015 W-2 tax forms, mistakenly believing that the request came from the Chief Executive Officer.

Upon learning of the incident, InvenSense immediately took steps to investigate. We quickly determined the nature and scope of the incident. We sought to track down and retrieve the information, but our efforts were unsuccessful.

We have notified two relevant current and former employees who are New Hampshire residents of this incident by e-mail on April 14, 2016 and will notify all three relevant current and former employees by postal mail on April 15, 2016. We have also arranged for LifeLock to provide employees with two years of credit monitoring services, at no charge to the employees.
