Our office represents Marker Group, Inc. ("Marker") located at 13105 Northwest Freeway, Suite 300 Houston, TX 77040. We write to supplement our December 30, 2021 notice to your office concerning an incident that may affect the privacy of personal information related to certain New Hampshire residents. Our prior submission is attached as *Exhibit A*. By providing this notice, Marker does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Since providing the initial notice, Marker continued its extensive internal review of the files that may have been subject to unauthorized access. Marker has now completed its review and identified all individuals that could have been impacted by the incident. On March 14th and April 12th, Marker provided notice of this incident to an additional approximate two hundred sixty-three (263) New Hampshire residents. The information related to these residents includes name, date of birth, Social Security number, and/or various types of medical records containing treatment and insurance information. Notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached as *Exhibit B*.

Marker is providing individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident with access to credit monitoring services for 12 months through TransUnion at no cost to the individuals. Marker is also providing potentially impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud, including advising individuals to report any suspected incidents of identity theft or fraud to their credit card company and/or bank. Additionally, Marker is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies,

("Marker Group") located at 13105 Northwest Freeway, Suite 300, Houston, Texas 77040, and are writing to provide your Office with preliminary notice of a recent data security event that may affect the security of personal information related to New Hampshire residents. By providing this preliminary notice, Marker Group does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data incident notification statute, or personal jurisdiction. This notice will be supplemented with any new, significant facts learned after its submission, including the total number of impacted New Hampshire residents.

Marker Group provides litigation support services to law firms in the United States, including hosting data for law firms' share and access during the course of a lawsuit. The information involved in this event is associated with third party lawsuits for which Marker Group provides litigation support services.

On September 3, 2021, Marker Group discovered suspicious activity on certain systems in its computer network. As a result, Marker Group immediately worked to secure its environment and, with the assistance of third-party computer specialists, launched an investigation to determine the nature and scope of the activity. On or about September 10, 2021, the investigation determined that certain files in Marker Group's systems may have been accessed by an unknown, unauthorized third party.

Marker Group therefore began a lengthy and time-intensive, thorough review of the potentially impacted folders and its internal files and systems in order to identify the information that was potentially impacted and to whom it related. Marker Group continues to diligently review the information and reconcile this information with its internal records in furtherance of identifying the individuals to whom the data relates and the appropriate contact information for those individuals. While the review is ongoing, at this time Marker Group has identified twelve (12) New Hampshire residents associated with protected information that may have been accessed by the actor.

On December 23, 2021, Marker Group notified all currently-identified individuals and will issue direct notice to additional individuals as they are discovered during the ongoing review. Importantly, there is no indication that individuals' specific information was or will be misused. Marker Group will supplement this notice to your Office and provide the total number of impacted New Hampshire residents upon completion of its review and identification of all impacted individuals.
