Dear Sir or Madam:

Pursuant to N.H. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 359-C:20, MNP Corporation ("MNP"), on behalf of its affiliate, General Fasteners Company, is notifying you that it has provided notice to citizens of New Hampshire of a data breach. MNP has learned that an employee was a victim of a phishing attack on March 6, 2016 resulting in disclosure of W-2 information for employees. The personal information of one New Hampshire citizen was included, and MNP has provided notification to them by U.S. Mail. A copy of the form of notice provided is enclosed with this letter.

[COMPANY NAME] ("the Company") recently discovered that an electronic file containing personal information was disclosed to a third party. The Company's investigation of the incident indicates that your completed W-2 tax form for 2015 was included in that file. The file was disclosed to the third party on March 6, 2016, and the Company discovered the issue on the same day.

The Company takes data security and the protection of your personal information very seriously and will continue to investigate and monitor this incident. Please remain vigilant about monitoring your credit report and account statements for incidents of fraud. To assist you, the Company has arranged and paid for a subscription to LifeLock services as described in our previous notice to you regarding this incident. Another copy of that letter is attached, with detailed instructions about how to enroll with LifeLock. You should report any suspected incidents of identity theft to local law enforcement or the state attorney general.
