Dear Shareholder:

It is important for us to share with you that on November 3, 2017, OppenheimerFunds was made aware of an incident which occurred between May 24, 2011 and October 16, 2017, in which certain information relating to you and your OppenheimerFunds account (including your name, address, Social Security number, and account number) was erroneously sent to a financial services firm with which OppenheimerFunds maintains an ongoing business relationship. While that firm was not authorized to receive your information, it is subject to confidentiality requirements under its agreement with us and under industry regulations. The receiving firm has confirmed to us that they will not use or share the information that was sent to them in error.

We are working diligently to protect your information, and we have addressed the issue that caused this error. Maintaining the security and confidentiality of our shareholders' personal information is one of our most important responsibilities. We apologize for any concern or inconvenience this matter may cause.

We understand that this incident may raise some concern about your privacy.
