*Re: Incident Notification*

Dear Attorney General Foster:

Our client, ProScan Imaging, LLC. ("ProScan"), understands the importance of protecting payment card information. On February 24, 2017, ProScan learned that one of our employees received a phishing email designed to appear as if it came from one of our Senior Executives. As a result of this phishing incident, we learned that an unauthorized individual may have obtained IRS Form W-2s for the 2016 employment year for some of our employees. Upon learning of this, we immediately began an investigation. Our investigation has determined that the unauthorized individual may have accessed employee 2016 IRS Form W-2, which includes employees' names, addresses, Social Security numbers and earnings.

ProScan provided written notification via U.S. Mail on March 2, 2017, to 1 New Hampshire resident in accordance with N.H. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 359-C:20 in substantially the same form as the document enclosed herewith. Notice is being provided in the most expedient time possible and without unreasonable delay. ProScan has established a dedicated hotline to answer any questions that individuals may have regarding the incident.

ProScan Imaging, LLC is committed to protecting the confidentiality and security of our employees' personal information. Regrettably, I am writing you to inform you of an incident involving some of that information.

**What Happened**

On February 24, 2017, we learned that one of our employees received a phishing email designed to appear as if it came from one of our Senior Executives. As a result of this phishing incident, we learned that an unauthorized individual may have obtained IRS Form W-2s for the 2016 employment year for some of our employees. Upon learning of this, we immediately began an investigation.

**What Information Was Involved**

Our investigation has determined that the unauthorized individual may have accessed your 2016 IRS Form W-2, which includes your name, address, , Social Security number and earnings.

**What We Are Doing**

As soon as we became aware of this situation, we notified the IRS and federal law enforcement authorities, and we are cooperating with their ongoing investigation. The IRS has indicated to us that they will monitor affected employees' accounts for this year, in an effort to prevent fraudulent tax refunds from being paid out. To help prevent something like this from happening again, we are reinforcing our information security training program with an emphasis on the detection and avoidance of phishing email scams and reviewing our internal procedures related to requests for sensitive information.

**What You Can Do**

We recognize this issue can be frustrating. We are taking steps to help protect you and we are offering you identity theft protection services through Experian **free of charge** for 2 years. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal information and provides you with identity protection services focused on immediate identification and resolution of

If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should immediately contact the Federal Trade Commission and/or the Attorney General's office in your state. You should also contact your local law enforcement authorities and file a police report. If you know or suspect you are a victim of tax-related identity theft, the IRS recommends these steps:

- Respond immediately to any IRS notice; call the number provided or, if instructed, go to [IDVerify.irs.gov](http://IDVerify.irs.gov).
- Complete IRS Form 14039, Identity Theft Affidavit, if your e-filed return rejects because of a duplicate filing under your SSN or you are instructed to do so. Use a fillable form at [IRS.gov](http://IRS.gov), print, then attach the form to your return and mail according to instructions.
- Continue to pay your taxes and file your tax return, even if you must do so by paper.
