RE: Data Breach Notification

Dear Attorney General MacDonald:

Please accept this as notice of a security breach concerning the personal information of New Hampshire residents. At this time, we have identified two (2) affected New Hampshire residents and will advise you if we discover that additional New Hampshire residents are affected.

On June 8, 2017, Sabre Hospitality ("Sabre") notified 21c Museum Hotels that unauthorized activity occurred within Sabre's Hospitality Solutions SynXis Central Reservation System affecting certain of 21c Museum Hotels's customers. The Sabre notification states the unauthorized activity occurred between August 10, 2016 and March 9, 2017. Sabre has not provided to us a specific date of their discovery of this incident.

Sabre's investigation concluded the unauthorized party was able to access cardholder name, address, payment card name, card expiration date, and, when collected, card security codes. Sabre states that it has notified law enforcement and payment card brands. Sabre has assured 21c Museum Hotels that the unauthorized activity has been stopped and is no longer possible, and that they have enhanced security around access credentials and the monitoring of system activity to further detect and prevent unauthorized access.

We are in the process of preparing notification letters to the affected customers, and anticipate mailing notice letters on or around July 6, 2017.
