Pursuant to your recent request, please find enclosed a pardon petition application. This office is charged with the responsibility of processing pardon petitions pursuant to RSA 4:21, et seq.

If you are eligible for an annulment of your criminal records, pursuant to RSA 651:5, please be advised that the Governor and Council will not consider your pardon petition until you provide documentation that you have applied for an annulment and it has been denied. You may seek guidance from an attorney if you have questions on how to petition for an annulment.

The petition must be completed in every detail and returned to this office. You may attach any recommendations to the form. This office is statutorily required to contact the prosecutor and sentencing judge on your case, and request any recommendation they may wish to submit. Governor and Council rules require that we obtain a criminal records check from the New Hampshire State Police, and, if you are incarcerated, a report from the Superintendent of the facility of your time spent there. In addition, the rules require the prosecutor to contact the victim in your case and obtain their response to your pardon petition. All information is available to the public, with the exception of the documentation from the New Hampshire State Police and Superintendent of any incarceration facility.

Once all responses are received, the entire package -- pardon petition application and recommendations submitted by you, together with recommendations received from the public officials and the results of our investigation -- will be submitted to the Governor and Executive Council, who will decide whether to grant you a pardon hearing.
