


Sixteen convictions Three felonies

"609, Bridge Hill Road, shots fired, I'm hit!"









Autopsy Results


Two gunshot wounds:

RSA 627:5, II(a): a law enforcement officer is justified in using deadly force when he reasonably believes that such force is necessary to defend himself or a third person from what he reasonably believes to be the imminent use of deadly force.

RSA 627:9, II, defines "deadly force" as "any assault . . . which the actor commits with the purpose of causing or which he knows to create a substantial risk of causing death or serious bodily injury."

"Purposely firing a weapon capable of causing serious bodily injury or death in the direction of another person . . . constitutes deadly force." RSA 627:9, II.
